- Treated Japanese knotweed (JK) in Benzie County (Clearcast); 8 stands, 1 acre
- Treated JK in Leelanau County (Clearcast); 15 stands, 1.5 acres
- Treated giant knotweed in Leelanau County (acetic acid); 2 stands, 0.5 acres
- Treated JK in Grand Traverse County (Clearcast); 16 stands, 2 acres
- Clipped purple loosestrife seedheads at Natural Education Reserve; 8 acres
- Treated Top 20 invasives in Brown Bridge Quiet Area bottomlands; 4 acres
- Treated invasive thistles at Brown Bridge Quiet Area bottomlands; ~22 acres
- Hand-swiped Phragmites at Brown Bridge; ~160 acres
- Surveyed Railroad Point Natural Area for Top 20 invasives; 14 acres
- Visited 2 Manistee Co. landowners regarding invasives on their properties; 5 present
- Submitted Great Lakes Restoration Initiative grant proposal
- Visited a Grand Traverse Co. landowner regarding invasives on their property; 2 present
